Pleasant High School Community Service Opportunities

What is community service?

Community Service-voluntary work intended to help people in a particular area.

How much community service should I do?

A MINIMUM of 5 hours of community service per school year is recommended. Community service is NOT a graduation requirement.

How can I earn a community service seal for graduation?

Students must earn at least two diploma seals for graduation. One seal that can be earned is the Community Service Seal. Students must complete 60 hours of documented service for the seal. The hours earned for this seal cannot begin before June 1st of the summer prior to a student's freshman year. It can be completed at any point during a student's four years of high school but must be concluded by March 1st of a student's senior year (unless otherwise approved by administration). The community service hours will be logged by the student on the Pleasant High School community service form and verified by the student's community service project supervisor. The community service activity (or activities) must be pre-approved by the district and cannot be court ordered community service. If the community service spans more than one school year, the student must submit documented hours at the conclusion of each school year. Evidence: Community service paperwork submitted to HS office.

Why should I do community service?

The spirit of giving....helping those in need, kindness, treating others as you would like to be treated.

Resume builder for college, work, scholarships, which can set you apart from others on applications.

Diploma seal for graduation.

Earn hours for possible National Honor Society induction.

Networking with new people which can lead to new opportunities in the future.

What types of community service could I do?
